Dear Speaker Boehner and Minority Leader Pelosi:

I write today on behalf of the National Association of Federal Credit Unions (NAFCU), the only trade association exclusively representing our nation's federally chartered credit unions, in conjunction with the House's efforts on capital formation and small business job creation. The nation's credit unions and their nearly 94 million members know that one of the best untapped resources to create jobs is to raise the arbitrary and outdated member business lending cap on credit unions.

A bipartisan group of 121 Representatives agree and have expressed their support for the *Small Business Lending Enhancement Act*, H.R. 1418, introduced by Representatives Ed Royce and Carolyn McCarthy. This job creating legislation would raise the arbitrary credit union member business lending cap in a way that promotes safety and soundness. Raising the cap would create jobs without spending a single dime of taxpayer money. It is also worth noting that the Treasury Department and the National Credit Union Administration have signed-off on this commonsense proposal. We strongly urge you to include this legislation as part of any efforts on capital formation and small business job creation.

We thank you for your continued commitment to finding ways to promote economic growth. Credit unions take great pride in serving nearly 94 million Americans across the country and stand ready to further assist in job creation efforts.
